Welcome

A Kangaroo Flat Working Group was formed in 2018 to provide a process where community members could contribute to the development of a Kangaroo Flat Community Plan (Plan). This work has been facilitated by the Kangaroo Flat Community House, and supported by the City of Greater Bendigo (the City).

The Plan identifies key priorities of the Kangaroo Flat community, that align with outcomes, goals and objectives within Mir wimbul (Council Plan 2021-2025). Accordingly the values mentioned in Mir Wimbul are also reflected in this plan.

The previous Plan was produced in 2009. Work on the new Plan has been set back several years due to the COVID-19 pandemic.





Themes, goals and projects

During December 2019, over 20 managers and staff from key stakeholder organisations met to hold a community 'Think Tank' to explore learnings from:

- · The existing community plan
- Achievements over the past 10 years
- 2019 Kangaroo Flat Street Survey
- Statistics including the Active Living Census 2019
- The experiences of living and/or working in Kangaroo Flat

All identified actions were molded into the following themes:

- 1 Active community Out and about
- **2 Business community -** A thriving business sector
- **3 Connected community -** *Community events and spaces*
- **4 Healthy community -** Access to health and wellbeing services
- **5 Learning community -** *Education, employment and training*
- 6 Environmentally sustainable community A place where people want to live and work, now and in the future

Vision

Through the community engagement for the development of this Plan, Kangaroo Flat was recognised as being 'a vibrant community for everyone'.



Out and about

An active community is one that is designed to be well connected, and where it is easy to use active transportation, such as walking and cycling, and public transport to get to around. Kangaroo Flat is the gateway to Bendigo from Melbourne, which results in a very busy highway dividing the town and impeding local connections. The community street survey that was undertaken to support this plan, found that 'getting around' was often a topic raised.

- Create more off-road, shared user paths to be better connected, i.e. Gurri Wanyarra Wellbeing Centre
- Pedestrian crossing over High Street
- Build new toilets and keep all toilets accessible and clean
- Redevelop Bendigo Creek Trail
- Develop better public transport options:
 - More logical routes, i.e. between Kangaroo Flat Train Station and Lansell Square, linked to Gurri Wanyarra Wellbeing Centre
 - More trains from Epsom to Kangaroo Flat
 - Improve transport costs, i.e. two hour or all-day tickets
 - Increase parking at Kangaroo Flat Train Station
 - Provide seats, bins and shelters at bus stops

2 Business community

A thriving business sector

Kangaroo Flat has a thriving business sector, both in manufacturing and retail. When business, community groups and the community work in partnership, everyone is advantaged. Businesses grow by embracing their social responsibility, and community groups gain through improved access to services, goods, knowledge and people skills. Encouraging business and community organisations to work together fosters a healthy and viable society.

Goal: Creating a connected community with a sense of pride

- Celebrate and help create a more inclusive and diverse community through education of services in the Kangaroo Flat community. Multicultural event with foods, dance, clothing and food truck culture
- Develop a larger community house and community hub-library. A co-location of services and facilities, accessible to a central space
- Improve on existing spaces by adding/ upgrading facilities to become more inclusive, i.e. Crusoe Reservoir, toilets, creating a beach and encouraging water activities
- Host an annual community event/ fair in Kangaroo Flat that is run by the community to attract others, as an opportunity to showcase local business. Possibly a Flat Matters Festival
- Host community conservation/focus events with groups to hear the voices and needs of the community
- Create new art murals in public spaces
- Redevelop the JB Osborne Theatre into an inclusive, creative performing arts space to support community needs and growth into the future



4 Healthy community



Access to health and wellbeing services

A healthy community is one in which all residents have access to safe and healthy homes, adequate physical activity, nutrition, and quality health care. In Kangaroo Flat we believe a healthy community continually works to assure that the prerequisites for health are provided to all members of the community and what is available is always clearly promoted.

An environmentally sustainable community focuses on developing ways to live that don't harm the environment or cause the lowest possible impact on it. Living sustainably means that people manage their needs in a way that will allow future generations to do the same.

Goal 1: Increase and improve green spaces

- More trees, positioned correctly and of the appropriate species
- More love and attention to the Kangaroo Flat Botanic Gardens
- Reimagining Bendigo Creek continuous maintenance

Goal 2: Improve sustainability

- Attract recycling businesses, i.e. recycling tyres into park benches
- Encourage green star rated building standards and include sustainable practices, i.e. solar panels, batteries and water tanks
- More education on sustainability
- Promote alternative transport methods, i.e. walking and cycling
- Increase social marketing on sustainability and promote environmental events such as Earth Hour and National Tree Day
- Provide water education and sustainability, recycled water stations/desalination

Goal 3: Improve food reliability

- Provide a growing food/farmers market to share homegrown products
- Hold garden programs at schools and the Kangaroo Flat Community House
- Plan for, and develop, nature strip gardens
- Provide community gardens for local families
- Start a food swap program through the Kangaroo Flat Community House

Implementing the plan



The Kangaroo Flat Community Plan has been developed by our local community, and now we need to work together to implement and build on the Plan to keep it relevant. To achieve the Plan's intended outcomes, a strong Community Plan Steering Committee (CPS Committee) needs to be established.

The CPS Committee would build on the existing strengths and skills of members of our local community, and ideally be made up of community members that can relate to the Plan's themes. For example, representatives from the Kangaroo Flat business, community service, health and environmental sectors, as well as a representative from the City.

The CPS Committee would meet on a regular basis and work through the Plan's goals, undertaking research, planning, design and potentially fundraising to progress these actions further. A City officer will support and connect the committee with the broader work of the City.



A united approach will assist in the development of communally beneficial relationships that results in improved outcomes for everyone. It is essential that the Kangaroo Flat Community Plan is regularly reviewed and monitored to ensure that the priorities and actions are relevant and up-to-date.

Process to date

- August 2018, Council roundtable
- · September 2018, working group formed
- July/August 2019, public survey conducted
- December 2019, 'Think Tank' held with 21 attendees
- February 2020, part time community development worker appointed to assist with the Plans development (appointment has now expired)
- March 2020, COVID-19, leading to the closure of the Kangaroo Flat Community House, and disbandment of the working group
- November 2022, Kangaroo Flat Community
 House and the City review and develop an Action
 Framework to guide the ongoing development of the
 Kangaroo Flat Community Plan
- March/April 2023, Kangaroo Flat Community House prepares a draft Plan for community discussion

Proposed next steps

- May 2023, a Community Plan survey is prepared and distributed along with the draft Plan to stakeholders and the broader Kangaroo Flat community for feedback
- May 2023, survey is active
- June 2023, the draft Plan is updated to reflect learnings from the survey. The Plan is submitted to the City for ratification
- November/December 2023, launch of the Kangaroo Flat Community Plan
- February 2024, call out to seek members of a Community Plan Steering Committee
- March 2024, Community Plan Steering Committee formed, and work progresses in the implementation of the Plan
